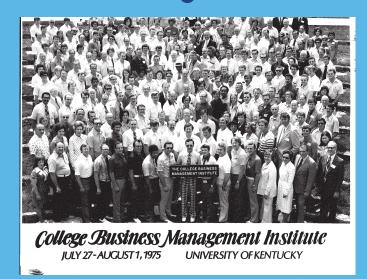
CBMI Over The Years

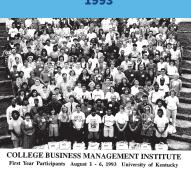


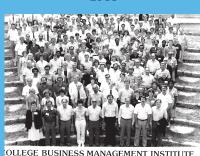

Scholarships
